## 2018 Form Six National Exam Results

In 2018, we had 91 beneficiaries (35 female and 56 male) who sat for the National Form Six Exams(ASCEE), all of our beneficiaries scored division 1-3, in their exams. These students currently are pursuing various courses in more than 21 Universities and Colleges in Tanzania

## 2018 Form Four National Exam Results

In 2018, we had 210 beneficiaries who sat for the National Form Four Exams (CSEE). 52 beneficiaries (22 Female and 31 male) scored division 1-3 on these exams. These beneficiaries are waiting for their Form Five allocation.

The rest of 158 beneficiaries will be joining colleges and Vocation Training Colleges.

## 2018 Form Two National Exam Results

In 2018, we had 18 beneficiaries who sat for the National Form Two Exam, for which 12 beneficiaries (3 female and 9 male) passed their exams.

# SATF COLLEGE BENEFICIARIES FORUM-2018

For the FY 2018, conducted the SATF College Beneficiaries Forum with objectives to gather her beneficiaries that were selected to join about 21 different universities and colleges for the academic year 2018/2019.

Purpose of this Forum being to equip these newly university/college students with knowledge on the college life, basic skills in career development.

Further to that the session provided training on self management leadership and self-goal accomplishing. This forum also

served an opportunity for awarding “ Best performing in Form 6 National exams.

The Forum gathered together a group of 61 (26 Female and 35 Male) beneficiaries in a One-Day-Forum at Stella Maris Hotel in Bagamoyo.

Mr. Joel Nanauka, a Life Coach, Corporate trainer for peak performance and author for personal development books, presented a motivational talk to inspire the participants on what attributes were required of them to do alongside their academic life. The trainer had two sessions.

## VTC TAILORED COURSES

The Trust designed Tailored-made Vocational Training course to support Most Vulnerable Children (MVC) who graduated from O level in year 2018. This is partly because not all MVC who graduate from ordinary secondary education manage to excel for further studies, major reasons being low performance in their final national exams.

To achieve this objective, the Trust has entered into Strategic Partnership with 3 Vocational Training Colleges in Sengerema ~Mwanza, Ulembwe~Njombe and St. Antony ~Mara.

63 beneficiaries were enrolled into Six Months Tailored Program courses, these courses include: Electrical installation, tailoring, ICT, Food Production, Hotel Management and motor vehicle mechanics.

These beneficiaries have successfully completed six month course from the

# BINTI NADHIFU, HEDHI SALAMA, VUNJA UKIMYA

**B**inti Nadhifu (BN) Project is a complementary support geared towards providing an additional and vital support to female students who are under SATF education program. This support is in form of sanitary pads and pants.

The Project aims to address the menstrual challenges facing Tanzania girls who cannot get access to sanitary pads and advocating for health and cleanliness of young girls in secondary schools.

In 2018, BN Pilot Project targeted 720 SATF MVC female beneficiaries under education program in 14 regions of Tanzania.

Understanding the delicacy of the menstrual health knowledge, the Trust prepared a forum that intended to introduce Binti Nadhifu Project to SATF stakeholders but also equip them with basic skills in Menstrual Hygiene Management(MHM), so as to promote effective collaboration with our stakeholders in the implementation of this project. This forum served as a TOT session to our stakeholders.

This TOT conference took place from 30th -31st July 2018 at St Gaspar Hotel and Conference Centre in Dodoma where it brought together 22 participants.

# UNLOCKING YOUTH POTENTIALS IN SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY IS A COUNTRY'S DIVIDEND

YOUTH are development catalyst and our development depends on how youth issues are addressed, in all spheres of life, including, academically and extra-curricular.

SATF is on the like perspective that reflects the Global Sustainable Development Goals and National Youth Development Policy, that, in this millennium of science and technology, young men and women are the greatest asset for the present and future. Therefore, integrating their potentials into science and technology is a great dividend.

They spur into driving force behind

social economic and political reforms in the sphere of rapid global changes. Bringing together youth to accelerate their aspiration, innovation and networking shall not be in vain.

Given that spirit, SATF sponsored 6 beneficiaries of education support program to attend the 4th Annual STEM Youth Boot Camp. The camp took place at St. Joseph University, Kibamba campus, from 1st to 5th January 2019. The 5 (3 female and 2 male) students in secondary education and 1 male in Vocational Training level, travelled from Mara, Morogoro, Kagera, Arusha and Tanga

to Dar es Salaam to participate in the 4th STEM camp. Apart from developing peer network, the camp inspired their potentials and creativity. It was a remarkable platform as a result, to share their various aspiration, such as science, engineering, mathematics and technology by theories and practical.

Ultimately, these ambitious youths are able to test, analyze, explain soil properties and implications to life, develop automatic android mobile application that monitors soil moisture and provides a status to the users, also automatic irrigation system that integrated information.

## GRANT DISBURSED IN YEAR 2018

During year 2018, the Trust managed to support 1508 (611 Female and 897 Male) beneficiaries with a total grant of TShs 833 Million. These beneficiaries were supported at different level of education from Primary School level to College/University level, health, nutrition and special program In 2018, the trust extended catchment area from 23 (2017) to 27 (2018) Districts, these new catchment areas include Kakonko, Kibondo, Geita and Chato.

## CELEBRATING OVER 20 YEARS MILESTONE

Benjamin Franklin once said “An investment in Knowledge pays the best interest”

In year 2018 SATF celebrated two successful decades since its establishment. The motto of the celebrations was “Miongo Miwili Tunasonga Mbele”

We are proud of our achievements and how the Trust has transformed its operations to suit the needs of its beneficiaries and reposition itself to adopt contemporary ways of implementing its programs. This has yield positive results its impact to the community the Trust is serving.

During the period, the Trust has transformed lives of more than 187,000 from Primary School to College levels. Among the support extended include; Education,

Health, Nutrition and other special support. About 630 Caregivers have been supported to start their Income generating projects so as to improve the House hold income. SATF has built the capacity of 4 Focal Development Colleges (Lindi rural, Njombe, Sengerema and Musoma) in various areas, also contributed to national campaigns such as Desks donation whereby 1,300 Desks have been donated to 9 Districts. Kakonko, Ilala, Kinondoni, Temeke, Kaliua, Chato, Shinyanga Municipal Misungwi district, and Songea Municipal,

As of December 2018, SATF has extended its support to 27 Districts of Tanzania mainland.

To commemorate the 20th Anniversary, the Trust saw the need to share its success with the Local Leaders (in localities SATF has existence), Community members, our beneficiaries ,SATF staff. The celebrations involved the following activities;

- Distributed 1,900 T-Shirts with the anniversary message to participants;
- Donated 30 Beds, 80 mattresses, 136 bedsheets and 30 mosquitos nets to Luhira, Buhangija and Mvomero Secondary School. Luhira & Buhangija Centre being Schools with pupils with special need.
- Provided Seeds Capital amounting to TZS 1.4 million was given to the former SATF beneficiaries that are small scale entrepreneurs (wajasiriamali).

Furthermore, the Trust engaged with its neighbours living around the Kiota House by way of ;

- Constructing a Mini-Clock Tower with lights and a soothing garden at the junction of Manyara & Maji maji Street to enrich the ambience of the surroundings.
- Road maintenance which included Manyara Street, Maji maji Street, Daima Street, Ruvu Street and Sangara Street.
- Provision of Seed Capital to Petty traders around the KIOTA building to boost their capital.
